Getting to Waratah Bay is Easy!



How do I get there from Melbourne?

- Jump on to the Monash Freeway, and **turn off at the Cranbourne exit.**
- Keep going all the way through Cranbourne, past the Tooradin Airfield that will be on the right and about 20 minutes later you'll see a sign saying 'South Gippsland Highway' directing you to Korumburra and Leongatha. **Turn off at this exit (It's just before a bridge overpass).**
- You'll pass through two towns (now with a new bypass) of Loch and Bena. Keep following the Highway through Korumburra and Leongatha as you need to head to Meeniyah where you want to turn off just on the other side of the town. You'll see the sign directing you to Fish Creek. **Turn right at the Fish Creek sign just on the other side of the town.**
- Just after passing through Fish Creek (Don't blink it's small but has nice meals at the pub) you'll see a sign directing you to Waratah Bay. **Turn right at the sign directing you towards Waratah Bay.**
- Keep following the signs and you'll need to turn right about 2 km up the road - You'll see a sign directing you to Waratah Bay. **Turn right towards Waratah Bay.**
- About 10 minutes drive from here, you'll see a fork in the road - **You want to go left here (It is sign posted)** - If you keep on going you'll end up in Walkerville.
- After passing through another fork in the road (about a 4 minute drive) you'll come around a slight right hand bend and see the sign to Waratah Bay. **Turn right here.**
- You can't get lost from here as it is the only road in to the town.
- Keep driving 3 km to the 90 degree right bend, and travel the rest of the 3 km to the township.
- A quick right and left and the **Waratah Bay Beach House is the second on the right hand side**, only two doors down from the Caravan Park entrance.

**That's it! Kick back and
Start relaxing!!**

So Many Things to do at Waratah Bay and around the area!

There are so many things to do at Waratah Bay (or even so little), and the BEST thing is that it is **very kids friendly!**

What to do:

- Nothing at all
 - Read a book
 - Enjoy each others company
 - Walking/Running along the beach
 - Fishing
 - Surfing
 - Bird watching
 - Kite surfing
 - Horse riding at Foster
 - Explore the bush tracks
 - Wind surfing
 - Looking for crabs in the rocks with the kids!
 - Launch the boat at the ramp
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- Check out the **Spectacular** views from the dam at the top of the hill on the fire track (marked on the map) – Make sure you bring your camera!
 - Visit Foster (a 20 minute trip by car) for shopping, dining & coffee!
 - Take a trip to the Fish Creek Pub! Magnificent meals and very friendly locals.
 - Visit the historic Lime Kilns of Walkerville – Closed now, but once supplied lime to Melbourne.
 - Fish & Chips at Port Albert – This is where the fishing boats dock and sell their fish straight to the Fish & Chip shops. The freshest place to eat your Fish & Chips and great scenery too.
 - **You Must** make time to visit Cape Liptrap Lighthouse – The windiest place in Australia! Lean forward and feel the force! The views are spectacular so make sure you take the camera here too.
 - Visit Cooks' Creek – See the waterfalls (Requires good physical fitness & footwear). Upon reaching the beach, turn right and walk past the rocks – It's about a 50 minute walk there from the starting point.
 - Take the kids to Shallow Inlet – On the way to Sandy Point, but keep on driving – About 20 minutes from the Waratah Bay Beach House. The HUGE sand dunes are great to roll down, and towards the water is SERIOUSLY soft sand that kids love to jump in – *(It has consumed many 4 wheel drives, so don't even attempt to drive near the waters edge – Cars are fine – Just stick to the driving track towards the vegetation).*
 - If you're in to 'brick a brac' (like me) then you have to visit '**Maria's Recycling Emporium**'. It has EVERYTHING that a second hand store doesn't! Metal, furniture, building materials, whitegoods – If I went on, there would be pages! It's just out of Foster on the way to Toora – **The road is Amy's Track** and you'll see it on the left hand side as you just get out of Foster on the South Gippsland Highway.
